PATRIARCHAL VISIT BY HIS BEATITUDE SVIATOSLAV SHEVCHUK

His Beatitude, Patriarch Sviatoslav Shevchuk, the Spiritual Father of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church universal, will visit us and celebrate the Divine Liturgy on Sunday, November 15, 2015 in our Cathedral at 2:30 pm, during which Consecrated Life will be honored. He will bless the newly installed mosaics of Blessed Sister Josaphata, SSMI and the Venerable Servant of God Metropolitan Andrew Sheptytsky. At the conclusion of the Divine Liturgy, he also will bless the bell tower with the bell from the original cathedral (named STEFAN) which will include special prayers for the betterment of the present situation in Ukraine today. Additional information is forthcoming.

ПАТРІАРШІ ВІДВІДИНИ БЛАЖЕННІШОГО СВЯТОСЛАВА ШЕВЧУКА

Блаженніший Патріярх Святослав Шевчук, Духовний Глава всієї Української Греко-Католицької Церкви, під час відвідин Філадельфії в неділю, 15 листопада 2015 р., відслужить о 2:30 дня в Катедрі Божественну Літургію, на якій буде вшановано Богомпосвячене життя. Патріярх також освятить нещодавно встановлені мозаїки Блаженної Сестри Йосафати, ССНДМ, та Преподобного Слуги Божого Митрополита Андрія Шептицького. На завершення Служби Божої Блаженніший благословить дзвіницю з дзвоном, який походить з найпершої нашої Катебри (називається СТЕФАН), що встановлена на посілості Катебри, і біля якої будуть молитися за покращення існуючої ситуації в Україні. Просимо слідкувати за додатковою інформацією.

THE FEAST OF THE HOLY APOSTLE AND EVANGELIST SAINT LUKE

Today, Sunday October 18th, is the FEAST DAY of St. Luke. He is the author-evangelist of the Gospel of Luke and the companion of the Apostle Paul mentioned of in some New Testament writings (Phil 1:24, 2 Tim 4:10-11) and was numbered among the Seventy Apostles. He was of Greek origin born in the city of Antioch and highly educated. His studies included Greek philosophy, medicine and art. He also was a physician by profession. He arrived in Jerusalem where he came to believe in the Lord, and it was he who was with Cleopas, who met the resurrected Lord, on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24). He is depicted in icons as an angel with the face of a calf, the third symbolical beast (calf) mentioned by Ezekiel (1:10) and Revelation (4:7), which is a symbol of Christ's sacrificial and priestly office, as pointed out by St. Irenaeus. His memory is celebrated on October 18 and also on April 22 with the Apostles Nathaniel and Clement, then on June 20 when his relics were translated to the Church of the Holy Apostles in Constantinople and finally on January 4, the Synaxis of the Seventy.

After Pentecost, he returned to Antioch, worked with the Apostle Paul traveling to Rome, converting Jews and pagans to the Christian Faith. "Luke, the beloved physician, ... greets you," writes the Apostle Paul to the Colossians (Colossians 4:14). At the request of Christians, he wrote his Gospel in the first century. Some accounts report this to be around 60 A.D., others state around 80 A.D. After St. Paul's martyrdom, Luke preached the Gospel in Italy, Dalmatia, Macedonia, and in other nearby regions.

Luke is also known as the founder of iconography since he wrote the first icon of the Most Holy Mother of God, known as the Directress (Hodigitria) which is mentioned in the Paraklesis service in her honor. The prayer reads: *"Speechless be the lips of the impious ones; those who do not reverence Your great icon, the sacred one which is called Directress, which was depicted for us by one of the apostles, Luke the Evangelist."* In all, he wrote three Marion icons as well as icons of the Holy Apostles Peter and Paul.



In old age, he visited Libya and Upper Egypt; from Egypt he returned to Greece, where he continued to preach and convert many with great zeal despite his age. He also wrote the Acts of the Apostles and dedicated each of these works to Theophilus, the local governor of Achaia. Luke was 84 years old when the wicked idolaters tortured him for the sake of Christ and hanged him from an olive tree in the town of Thebes, in Beothia of Greece. His miracle-working relics were transported to Constantinople in the 4th-century during the reign of Emperor Constantius. In 1204, the Crusadors of the IV Crusade stole the relic from Constantinople and transported it to Padua, Italy where it is still located in the Church of Saint Justina. In 1992, then Metropolitan Ieronymos of Thebes and Levathia requested the return of a "a significant fragment of the relics of St. Luke to be placed on the site where the holy tomb of the Evangelist is located and venerated today". This prompted an investigation of his relics in Padua confirming they are of a Syrian man who died between 130 and 400 A.D. The Bishop of Padua then delivered the rib closest to St. Luke's, heart to Metropolitan Ieronymos, to be kept in his tomb in Thebes, Greece. His tomb belonged to a Roman family of the 2nd-century BC, which was later emptied and used as the repository of his relic by the Christians of Thebes since it was a majestic one. The tomb works miracles even today; eg. it is reported that on December 22nd, 1997 at 1:30 pm myrrh appeared on the tomb's marble and since then the interior of the tomb remains fragrant.

Baby Bottles for Life Coming Soon!

Beginning next Sunday, our cathedral parish will support mothers and babies through the Baby Bottles for Life Fundraiser. Next weekend October 24-25, 2015, every parishioner will have the opportunity to take a bottle to fill with spare change and help change a life! Bottles will be distributed at the end of all Divine Liturgies next weekend and will be collected on the two weekends, ie. October 31-November 1 and November 7-8, 2015.

Legacy of Life Foundation funds two crisis pregnancy centers in Bristol, PA and Philadelphia, PA that serve over 500 families who cannot provide for simple baby supplies for their children. Many women visit the center and receive free services which give them the strength to say yes to life when baby supplies and support might have been the only reason to say no. Many of the women who come through our doors believe abortion is their only option. The centers provide counseling, material, and financial support for women so that they are able to receive the truth about their choice and live a healthy good life. In 2014 alone, with God's grace over 281 women were saved from abortion at our centers.

We are asking that you take a bottle home and fill it with checks, coins or bills, and return them to the church the following weekend when you come to the Divine Liturgy. A bassinet will be placed in the vestibule of the church and volunteers will be available to collect bottles on their return. **ANY CHECKS SHOULD BE MADE PAYABLE TO: "The Missionary Sisters of the Mother of God" with the memo "LOLF".** To find out more about this life-saving work, please watch a brief video at www.legacyoflifefoundation.org. 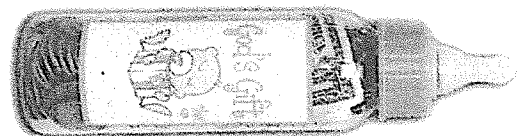

If a child lives with encouragement, he learns confidence.

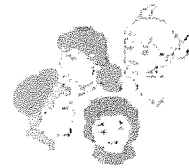
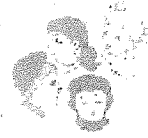
If a child lives with praise, he learns to appreciate.

The Liturgy of the Faithful

"The Symbol of Faith (The Creed)"

Following the Embrace of Peace, the Symbol of Faith, also called the Nicene Creed, is recited by the clergy and the people.

1. It is introduced by the priest or deacon who says: *"The doors! The doors! In wisdom let us attend."*

a. Historically, these words were said as a reminder that all catechumens should have been dismissed.

(Meaning to close the doors of the church to outsiders.)

b. Also, the doors represent our mouths and ears.

• We are called each week to open our mouths and ears and recall the expression of faith first said at our baptism.

Why do we say the Creed?

1. It is an expression of our personal faith. (We say: "I believe"...not "We believe")

a. This is the only place in the Divine Liturgy where the first person pronoun is used during worship.

2. The Nicene Creed is the "Definition of who we are as Christians."

3. Without the expression of faith, the Divine Liturgy has no meaning and cannot proceed.
