
## So That Mercy Can Enter

# The Fifth Sunday of the Great Fast The Sunday in memory of Saint Mary of Egypt

Today on the Fifth Sunday of the Great Fast, we celebrate the memory of our holy venerable Mother, Saint Mary of Egypt. The recorder of the life of this wonderful saint is Saint Sophronius who was the Patriarch of Jerusalem in the years 634-638.

During this same time, a certain priest-monk by the name of Abba Zosimas, who was greatly respected for his holiness and asceticism, had gone off, as it was


customary, during the Great Fast on a twenty days' walk into the wilderness across the Jordan. While in the desert, he suddenly caught sight of someone who was very thin and withered and unclothed, who had hair as white as snow and who Zosimas' from sight nakedness. The elder ran a long way, until this figure stopped at a stream and called out to him: "Father Zosimas, forgive me for the Lord's sake. I cannot turn around to look at you, for I am a naked woman." At this, he threw his outer cloak to her, and she wrapped herself in it and then turned around to him. The elder was amazed at hearing his name from the lips of this unknown woman. After some considerable prodding and pressure on his part, she began to tell him her life story.



Her name was Mary and she was born in Egypt and had lived as a prostitute in Alexandria from the age of twelve, spending seventeen years in this way of life. Urged by the lustful fire and desires of the flesh, she one day boarded a ship that was sailing for Jerusalem. Arriving at the Holy City, she attempted to enter into one of the churches to venerate the Precious Cross of Christ, but some unseen power prevented her from entering in. This power buffeted her that she could not walk through the doors into the Church. Great fear gripped her, which caused her to turn to an icon of the Mother of God that was in the entrance of the Church. She begged the Mother of God to let her enter in and venerate the Holy Cross, after confessing her sins and impurity, and promising that she would go wherever the Most Pure Lady would lead her. She was then allowed to enter into the Church. After venerating the Holy Cross, she went out again to the entrance and, standing in front of the icon, thanked the Mother of God for answering her prayer.

Then Mary heard a voice saying, "If you cross the Jordan, you will find True Peace." She immediately bought three loaves of bread, and set off for the Jordan, arriving there that same evening. She received Holy Communion the following morning in the monastery of St. John the Baptist, and then finally crossed the river, where she spent the next forty eight years in the desert where she would experience her greatest and worst torments of thoughts of lust and passion, in terror and in many struggles that appeared to her as gigantic beasts, all this time she was living off of and feeding on plants only.

Later, when she was standing in prayer, Father Zosimas saw her being lifted up in the air. She begged him to bring her Holy Communion the next year at the same banks of the Jordan River, where she would come to receive it. The following year, Zosimas came with the Holy Gifts in the evening to the banks of the Jordan



and stood in amazement as he saw Mary cross the river. He saw her coming in the moonlight and, arriving to a further bank, where she made the sign of the Cross over the river. She then walked across it as though it were dry land. When she had received Holy Communion, she begged him to come again the following year to the same stream by which they had first met. The next year Zosimas came again, but found her dead body there on that spot, and above her head in the sand was written: "Father Zosimas, bury the body of the humble Mary, in this place. Give dust back to the dust. I passed away on April 1, on the very night of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ's Passion, after receiving Holy Communion of the Divine Mysteries." And so Abba Zosimas buried the body of

this wonderful saint, Mary of Egypt. When he returned back to the monastery, he recounted the whole story of her life and the wonders to which he had been an eyewitness. She entered into eternal rest in about the year 530. What a humbling and silencing wonder this is! How in such a manner, does the Lord glorify repentant sinners.

St. Mary of Egypt is remembered today, as we reach the end of the Great Fast, to arouse the energy of the slothful and to urge sinners to repentance, by imitating her example. She is also commemorated on April 1, the day of her earthly death and hopeful rest in the Lord. The Righteous Abba Zosimas, who buried St. Mary, is commemorated on April 4. Let us pray:

"O Christ our God, through the intercession of our Venerable Mother Mary of Egypt, have mercy on us and save us. Amen."
